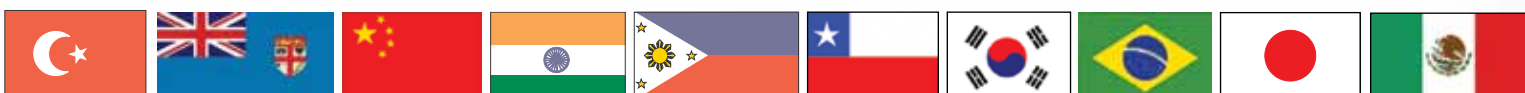

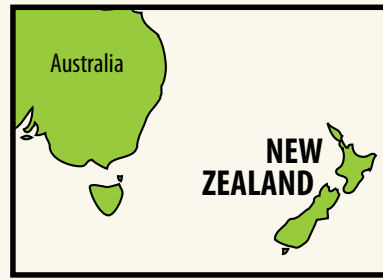

Certificate in English

Starter to Advanced

Start: Various

Qualification Details

This certificate is for students who wish to develop their English language skills for daily life and employment in New Zealand, and for further tertiary study. Students can commence studying on any date and their English level is assessed for entry into the appropriate level: beginners, elementary, pre-intermediate, intermediate, upper-intermediate and advanced.

Students take part in interactive activities to develop listening, reading, writing and speaking skills and to increase their range of grammar and vocabulary. Regular assessments enable progression to higher levels. Students may study for any number of weeks part time or full time until they reach their required proficiency level.

Certificate in English Level Test results are accepted as evidence of English proficiency for entry to Waiariki mainstream qualifications.

Graduates will be able to:

- communicate with confidence at their level of achievement;
- use English for employment in fields related to their existing skills and qualifications; and
- progress to further study in certificate, diploma or degree levels.

Teacher Training Groups

These short courses are ideal for teachers of English and other staff from overseas institutions. The courses are customised to suit the group and to provide specialised teaching and experiences in their desired areas. Timing and length of courses can be arranged to suit.

English Study Tour Programmes

Duration: Enrol any time by arrangement

You will have fun with your classmates and teachers learning everyday English at your level and working on preparation and follow up for some of the afternoon activities.

At the final student presentations, you can demonstrate what you have learned, making the English learning experience more relevant, interactive, powerful and fun. A leaving certificate will show the length of your course and the level of English that you have successfully attained.

Lessons take place in the mornings and sightseeing activities in the afternoons.



IELTS Centre

Waiariki is an official IELTS (International English Language Testing System) testing centre. IELTS tests provide proof of English competency for entry into mainstream qualifications at Waiariki and throughout New Zealand.

Diploma in Accounting

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides an entry level qualification for those who wish to gain a broad base of knowledge and skills in accounting and/or finance. This qualification also provides the initial platform for students to gain the academic requirements for an accounting technician awarded by New Zealand Institute of Chartered Accountants (NZICA).

Graduates will be able to:

- apply basic accounting knowledge and techniques to the workplace;
- operate in roles such as administrative assistant, accounts clerk and office manager in a small to medium business;
- pursue further specialised study in the New Zealand Diploma in Business (Level 6) and/or the Bachelor of Applied Management; and
- pursue an area of interest.

Diploma in Business and Information Systems

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This entry level qualification provides the skills, knowledge and competencies to apply introductory business knowledge and management skills to a range of business functions and situations.

Graduates will be able to:

- apply introductory business skills and knowledge to a range of business functions, situations and processes;
- operate in roles such as sales or marketing officer, human resources assistant, accounts clerk or office manager in a medium size business organisation; and
- pursue further study in Year 2 of the Bachelor of Applied Management or Bachelor of Commerce (University of Canterbury). University of Canterbury entry requirements will apply.

Diploma in Business Studies

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides an entry-level qualification for those who are seeking a career or already working in an office or junior management role. This qualification will enable students to apply introductory business knowledge and management skills to a range of business processes.

Graduates will be able to:

- apply introductory business skills and knowledge into their present employment roles;
- operate in roles such as administrative assistant, accounts clerk or office manager in a small to medium business organisation; and
- pursue further specialised or higher education.



Bachelor of Applied Management

Duration: 3 years full-time

Majors Available

- Business Management
- Forestry Management

Qualification Details

This degree provides a holistic view of organisations and allows students to examine the interface between education, organisations and the community from a socioeconomic perspective. This qualification enables students to develop the skills and knowledge of management required to successfully work in the business sector of Aotearoa/New Zealand, and provides regional contextualisation for applied management study.

Graduates will be able to:

- apply contemporary management theories and practice to the solution of work-based problems within the business environment;
- use both formal and informal networks to inform management practice from a technological and socioeconomic perspective;
- explore best practice through the process of critical thinking and reflection;
- contribute to the discussion of indigenous business and entrepreneurialism;
- direct the use of resources of an organisation to achieve objectives and achieve long term sustainability;
- participate in organisational planning activities from operational goal setting to strategic planning;
- recognise and respond to significant changes within the environment that impact on the organisation's ability to achieve objectives;
- use a variety of presentation skills;
- apply the principles of ethics, respect and accountability to professional practice;
- engage successfully as a team member; and
- organise and undertake ethical research.

Graduate Diploma in Applied Management

Duration: 1 year full-time

Strands Available

- Business
- Forestry
- Health
- Māori Development

Qualification Details

This graduate diploma provides an opportunity to acquire additional specialist knowledge and skills in the field of management in chosen strands of business, forestry, health and Māori development. This qualification enables students to develop the management skills and knowledge required to successfully work in and manage a sustainable business operation in Aotearoa/New Zealand.

Graduates will be able to:

- solve work-based problems through an understanding of contemporary management theories and practice;
- demonstrate a higher level of knowledge of essential management principles including leadership, strategic management and marketing;
- direct the use of resources of a private or public organisation to achieve the organisation's objectives and achieve long term sustainability;
- produce, analyse and synthesise empirical data which will contribute to well-informed decision making;
- apply research techniques to real world situations, as part of their development into independent and effective problem solvers;
- explore best practice through the process of critical thinking and reflection; and
- think independently and critically with respect to the management of the organisation's resources in both domestic and international contexts.

Graduate Diploma in Sport Management*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This graduate diploma provides students with an advanced understanding of sport and how the principles of management and marketing apply to this discipline. Students will learn to consider the sports industry from its broadest definition and will apply management and business theory to a sport, recreation, event and facility context.

Graduates will be able to:

- solve work-based problems through an understanding of contemporary management theories and practice;
- apply research techniques to real world situations;
- use the skills and technical expertise developed during the qualification in all facets of sport and event management; and
- address the many issues in the rapidly growing area of sport, recreation, event and facility management.

**Pending approval*

Diploma in Commerce

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides an entry level qualification that seeks to provide students with the skills, knowledge and competencies to apply introductory business knowledge and management/information technology skills to a range of business processes.

Graduates will be able to:

- apply introductory business skills and knowledge to a range of business processes;
- operate in roles such as sales or marketing officer, human resources assistant, accounts clerk or office manager in a medium sized business; and
- pursue further study in Year 2 of the Bachelor of Applied Management, Bachelor of Commerce (Lincoln University) or Bachelor of Software and Information Technology (Lincoln University). Lincoln University entry requirements will apply.

Diploma in Human Resource Management

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides an entry-level qualification for those students already working in a lower or mid-level human resources role, who lack the time to complete a full-time two year qualification such as the New Zealand Diploma in Business (Level 6). This qualification provides a range of specialised knowledge in organisational management, human resource management and employment law.

Graduates will be able to:

- apply basic management knowledge and human resource skills to their workplace;
- operate as a lower to middle manager, with a human resource focus, in a small to medium sized business enterprise;
- develop and improve a range of processes for recruitment, retention, training and development;
- critique and analyse an employment agreement negotiation; and
- research and analyse a human resource problem within a business context and develop various solutions to that problem.

Diploma in Marketing

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides an entry-level qualification for those who are seeking a career or already working in marketing, sales and related industries. This qualification provides the skills, knowledge and competencies to apply marketing functions to business planning and operations and to undertake a range of specialised activities in sales, marketing or public relations roles.

Graduates will be able to:

- comprehend how the marketing concept can be integrated into all business functions;
- apply marketing skills and knowledge to a range of business activities in their own job, or chosen career;
- analyse the market environment and prepare a marketing plan for a specific business entity; and
- undertake further study in marketing and/or communications at degree level.

New Zealand Diploma in Business (Level 6)

Duration: 2 years full-time

Qualification Details

This national diploma provides a broad base of business knowledge and skills in areas such as communications, human resource management, law, accounting or economics. This qualification also provides the opportunity to specialise in areas such as accounting, marketing, or human resource management.

Graduates will be able to:

- add value by applying specific business skills;
- apply a range of interpersonal and communication skills;
- apply critical problem-solving skills with initiative and judgement;
- recognise ethical and cultural issues inherent in decision making;
- work independently and within teams of diverse people; and
- pursue further study and professional development.

Entry Requirements

Admission and entry requirements for this qualification are in accordance with Waiariki's Academic Regulations and the following criteria:

Students less than 20 years old must have:

- a minimum of 14 numeracy credits at Level 1 or higher in mathematics or pangarau on the National Qualifications Framework; and
- 50 credits at Level 2 or above with at least 12 credits in each of three subjects including a minimum of eight literacy credits at Level 2 or higher in English or te reo Māori; four credits must be in reading and four credits must be in writing. The literacy credits will be selected from a schedule of approved achievement standards and unit standards; or
- equivalent to both of the above.

English Language Competency

International students whose first language is not English must have an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score of 6.0 (academic) with no individual band lower than 5.5, or TOEFL score of 550 or IELTS equivalents.

Diploma in Computing, Communications and Technology (Level 5)*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides a clear level of competence in the use of computer applications for business. Students will gain experience in learning how to manage computer systems, and an opportunity to learn how to understand and write technical material, enabling them to progress to higher level qualifications in this field.

Graduates will be able to:

- use computer applications competently to complete standard business requirements;
- understand the role of IT in business organisations;
- demonstrate their ability to learn new computer applications and operating systems;
- maintain, upgrade and trouble shoot computer systems;
- understand technical information and effectively communicate to specified audiences;
- understand basic object oriented programming concepts; and
- understand how data is represented inside the computer and stored within a database management system.

Depending on choice of electives, graduates may also:

- gain skills in screen design and use of media element development packages; and
- understand copyright issues associated with multimedia and web sites;

OR

- understand logic structures, sub programmes and parameters for a programming language; and
- be able to design and write modular programs using intermediate level data structures;

OR

- know the features of the internet and email; and
- have the ability to design and create web pages using a basic internet programming language and a web page authoring package.

Diploma in Computing, Communications and Technology (Level 6)*

Duration: 2 years full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides theoretical and applied knowledge of computing, including: design and maintenance of computer systems, databases, programming, operating systems, computer networking, technical support and embedded controller applications for a wide range of industries. This programme of study allows people employed in the computing industry to gain current knowledge and skills to equip them for work in a variety of IT positions.

Graduates will be able to:

- show competency when applying technical and conceptual thinking;
- show self reliance and motivation for continued learning and professional development;
- be effective communicators and team members;
- apply enquiring, flexible, creative and critical attitudes towards contemporary issues and underlying theoretical concepts; show awareness of bicultural issues and an ability to function positively in a multicultural society;
- understand the role of IT in business organisations;
- demonstrate their ability to learn to new computer applications and operating systems;
- maintain, upgrade and trouble shoot computer systems;
- understand technical information and effectively communicate to specified audiences;
- understand basic object oriented programming concepts; and
- understand how data is represented inside the computer and stored within a database management system.

**Pending approval*

Diploma in Information Technology*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides students with theoretical and applied knowledge of computing, including: design and maintenance of computer systems, databases, programming, operating systems, computer networking and technical support for a wide range of industries. This programme of study allows people employed in the computing industry to gain current knowledge and skills to equip them for work in a variety of IT positions.

Graduates will be able to:

- show competency when applying technical and conceptual thinking;
- show self reliance and motivation for continued learning and professional development;
- apply the capabilities to be effective communicators and team members;
- apply enquiring, flexible, creative and critical attitudes toward contemporary issues and underlying theoretical concepts;
- show awareness of bicultural issues and an ability to function positively in a multicultural society;
- understand of the role of IT in business organisations;
- demonstrate an ability to learn to new computer applications and operating systems;
- maintain, upgrade and trouble shoot computer systems;
- understand technical information and effectively communicate to specified audiences;
- understand basic object-oriented programming concepts; and
- understand how data is represented inside the computer and stored within a database management system.

Bachelor of Computing, Communications and Technology

Duration: 3 years full-time

Majors Available

- Computing Technical
- Multimedia/Web
- Systems Design

Qualification Details

This degree provides thorough theoretical and applied knowledge of computing with specialisations in the design and maintenance of computer systems, databases, programming, operating systems, computer networking, technical support and embedded controller applications for a wide range of industries. This will enable them to be work ready on graduation, and to maintain their currency and develop their discipline by ongoing professional development.

Graduates will be able to:

- competently apply theoretical and applied knowledge to work in the computing and technology fields;
- competently apply technical and conceptual thinking in the computing and technology fields; show self reliance and capability for continued learning and professional development in the computing and technology fields;
- demonstrate capabilities to be effective communicators and team members;
- employ a broad educational base to enable them to relate to the wider context of society;
- apply enquiring, flexible, creative and critical attitudes towards contemporary issues and underlying theoretical concepts in the computing and technology fields;
- show an appreciation of management and information technology within the context of their qualification;
- show awareness of bicultural issues and an ability to function positively in a multicultural society; and
- understand social and ethical issues when designing a computing product.

Graduate Diploma of Computing and Technology

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This graduate diploma provides up-to-date theoretical and applied knowledge to broaden students' expertise in the computing industry by studying a specialist field that complements their current experience and/or qualifications. This qualification enables students to maintain their currency and develop their discipline by ongoing professional development.

Graduates will be able to:

- build on their current underpinning knowledge and skills to apply technical and conceptual thinking in specialist computing and technology fields including internet and web development, computer systems design, computer networking, communications technology, gaming and animation and embedded systems;
- competently analyse, solve, manage and take responsibility for broadly defined problems in specialist computing and technology fields including internet and web development, computer systems design, computer networking, communications technology, gaming and animation and embedded systems; and
- undertake further learning and professional development.

Diploma in Applied Technology

Duration: 2 years full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma enables students to operate at a management or supervisory level through the application of technology and management skills, in conjunction with applied skills and competencies in a field of technical specialisation. Students may pursue specialist strands included in this qualification.

Graduates will be able to:

- effectively manage a trade organisation's physical, technical resources and operations in a specialist field;
- apply essential management theories and practice to the solution of trade work-based problems;
- apply technical expertise in their specialised field;
- identify core business and technical issues and implement risk management measures;
- gain a specialised endorsement in their specific area of interest;
- gain work experience in an appropriate industry; and
- obtain business communication skills.



Diploma in Early Childhood Education*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides an introduction to early childhood education. Students will develop a range of knowledge and skills across key elements of early childhood education, allowing them to progress into employment as a home-based early childhood provider, nanny or teacher aide, or continue on to the Diploma of Teaching (Early Childhood Education) or further tertiary study.

Graduates will be able to:

- understand the New Zealand early childhood curriculum;
- communicate effectively with young children, parents and whanau;
- understand young children's growth and development and factors that impact or enhance;
- demonstrate the knowledge, skills and attitudes of a professional educator; and
- communicate the main regulatory requirements that impact on the early childhood sector.

*Pending approval

Diploma of Teaching (Early Childhood Education): Te Pōkairua Whakaako Kōhungahunga

Duration: 3 years full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides the early childhood education sector with graduates who are both confident and competent teachers, and who are able to bring a bicultural understanding and practice to the communities in which they live and work.

The qualification will promote excellence in teaching and learning, and will enable students to develop the abilities of independence, metacognition and research skills. Such skills will equip students for life-long learning and further postgraduate study.

Graduates will have the knowledge, skills and dispositions required to gain New Zealand Teachers Council provisional registration and to be effective teachers.

Graduates will be able to:

- meet the Graduating Teacher Standards: Aotearoa/New Zealand;
- have the knowledge, skills, and attitudes of professional educators;
- understand the principles and values of Te Whāriki and be able to implement them in a range of early childhood settings;
- communicate and relate effectively and appropriately with children, parents/family/whānau/caregivers, other teachers and other professionals;
- understand individual learners in their social context, and be able to effectively shape the learning environment;

- understand the principles of bicultural education and show sensitivity to cultural differences between Māori and Pākehā, and the unique nature of the local community;
- have an understanding about what to teach, about the ways in which the child's mind processes knowledge, and be able to present knowledge in an integrated and holistic way;
- be aware of the importance of research, its limitations and of the ethical considerations involved;
- be committed to inclusiveness and social justice, recognising and accepting the rights and responsibilities associated with the education and care of infants, toddlers and young children;
- understand the need to abide by the Early Childhood Council and New Zealand Teachers Council Codes of Ethics; and
- have the capability to be lifelong learners, and be able to apply theory to practice and reflect on practice.

Entry Requirements

Admission and entry requirements for this qualification are in accordance with Waiariki's Academic Regulations and the following criteria:

- Applicants must undergo a police check;
- Applicants must provide two character references;
- Applicants must complete an interview process; and
- Part-time enrolments will require approval from the school director.

English Language Competency

International students whose first language is not English must have an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score of 7.0 (academic) or IELTS equivalents.

Special Entry Conditions

Applicants who do not meet all entry requirements may be admitted under special entry conditions.



Diploma in Forestry Operations*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provide an entry level qualification in forest operations management for students who wish to commence work in junior management roles in forestry or harvesting operations in the New Zealand forest industry. This qualification also provides the initial platform to progress toward the National Diploma in Forestry (Operations Management) (Level 5)*, Diploma in Resource Management (Level 6) or a degree in forestry science or applied management.

Graduates will be able to:

- understand the full range of operations undertaken in commercial plantation forestry;
- plan and monitor production and quality of commercial forestry operations;
- plan and implement forest inventories for forest management;
- use the most up-to-date planning tools and technology to collect and manage data including Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and Global Positioning System (GPS);
- undertake and evaluate forestry and harvesting operational planning; and
- apply knowledge of business management systems in the commercial forestry environment.

*Pending approval

National Diploma in Forestry (Operations Management) (Level 5)

Duration: 1½ years full-time

Qualification Details

This national diploma develops the range of operational management skills and knowledge which are required for people who aspire to manage operations in a commercial plantation forest on a sustainable basis.

The qualification provides students with general knowledge, skills and practical experience of all aspects of the planning and management of commercial plantation forests, including people management, technical forestry, applied science, business management, process improvement and financial skills.

Students completing this national diploma will also gain practical experience within a commercial forest by carrying out work placements between semesters.

Graduates will be able to:

- plan and manage operations in a commercial plantation forest on a sustainable basis;
- meet the objectives of the forest owner;
- understand the full range of operations undertaken in commercial forestry, including establishment and tending of forests, and the production and distribution of log products;
- explain and apply principles of forest management;
- use the most up-to-date planning tools and technology including Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and Global Positioning System (GPS);
- undertake forestry and harvesting operational planning and management;
- demonstrate the leadership skills of effective communication, team building and conflict resolution in the workplace; and
- apply knowledge of financial management systems and business planning in the commercial forestry environment.

Diploma in Resource Management

Includes:

- National Diploma in Forestry (Operations Management) (Level 5)

Duration: 2 years full-time

Strands Available

- Business Management
- Forestry
- Information Technology
- Māori Development
- Wood Processing

Qualification Details

This diploma, which includes a national diploma, provides a blend of management skills to allow graduates to successfully work in any aspect of commercial forestry in New Zealand in areas as diverse as forest management, forestry or harvesting operations, contract management, log product logistics, supply chain management, or commercial and financial analysis.

This diploma also provides a pathway for students to progress toward a degree in forestry science, applied management, computing systems, commerce, or Māori development.

Graduates will be able to:

- demonstrate a sound knowledge of technical and practical forestry;
- apply a good working knowledge of computers and the software commonly used in commercial forestry;
- gain a technical and/or management role in the forestry industry (e.g., operations manager), or as a forestry consultant, researcher, project manager or crew/team leader; and
- pursue an area of interest.

Diploma in Hospitality Management

Includes:

- National Diploma in Hospitality (Management) (Level 5)

Duration: 2 years full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma, which includes an embedded national diploma, produces graduates that are competent in a range of operational hospitality skills in food and beverage service, accommodation services and kitchen production. In addition, the qualification will enable the development of supervisory and management skills and knowledge that can be utilised throughout most sectors of the hospitality industry in New Zealand and overseas.

Graduates will be able to:

- manage methods and processes specific to the hospitality industry, including commercial accommodation, food and beverage, and facility utilisation;
- implement hospitality management control systems and personnel recruitment and selection; and
- understand business methods and processes, including marketing principles and computer concepts, and those principles related to tourism industry operations.

Diploma in Hotel Management*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma produces graduates that are suitable for employment at supervisory level. It provides a broad understanding of the hospitality industry and knowledge of the underlying management principles involved. These management skills and knowledge can be utilised throughout all sectors of the hotel industry in New Zealand and overseas.

Graduates will be able to:

- manage methods and processes specific to the hospitality industry, including commercial accommodation, food and beverage, and facility utilisation;
- implement management control systems and personnel recruitment and selection; and
- understand business methods and processes, including marketing principles.

**Pending approval*

Graduate Diploma in Hotel Management*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This graduate diploma provides an opportunity to acquire additional specialist knowledge and skills in the field of hotel management. This qualification enables students to develop the management skills and knowledge required to successfully manage an accommodation business.

Graduates will be able to:

- understand the sound management of all areas of the accommodation sector;
- think independently and critically with respect to the management of an accommodation business;
- understand essential management principles including marketing, planning and sustainability;
- produce data contributing to well-informed decision making; and
- apply research techniques to real world situations, as part of their development into independent and effective problem solvers.

**Pending approval*



Diploma in Manufacturing

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides a sound knowledge of underpinning applied management theory as applicable to the manufacturing industry, to enable students to analyse manufacturing operations and make critical decisions on improvement activities and processes at an operational level. New courses have been included for students to be able to interact with and demonstrate a practical knowledge of existing and evolving specialist industry technology used in the manufacturing sectors.

This qualification is intended for people with either limited or no prior experience or technical expertise in manufacturing processes, who wish to acquire broad knowledge and understanding of the operational divisions of this sector. The knowledge and understanding gained from this qualification will provide sound preparation for entry into management-level positions within the manufacturing sector across a range of operational divisions.

Graduates will be able to:

- provide leadership capability in a first line management role;
- work on the business – not in the business;
- optimise resources, processes and product flows;
- contribute to the technical development of manufacturing organisations; and
- act as a resource for production staff and leaders on a project and tactical level.

Diploma in Sustainable Energy

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma creates awareness of the social, cultural, global and environmental impacts of energy technology, and the principles of sustainable energy development. The knowledge and practical skills achieved will provide the skills required for employment within the operational areas of renewable energy producers, retailers and users.

Graduates will be able to:

- understand renewable energy and technologies, energy efficiency, management and production;
- carry out an energy audit on a residential property;
- support project completions;
- analyse alternative energy sources and their efficiencies; and
- understand resources required for production staff and leaders, for projects at a tactical level.



Graduate Diploma in Environmental Management*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This graduate diploma provides an opportunity to acquire additional specialist knowledge and skills in the field of environmental management. This qualification enables students to develop the management skills to plan and implement actions geared toward improving the quality of the human environment.

Graduates will be able to:

- apply research techniques to real world situations, as part of their development into independent and effective problem solvers;
- use the skills and technical expertise developed during the qualification in all facets of the environmental arena; and
- address the many issues in the highly complex and changing area of environmental management.

**Pending approval*

Graduate Diploma in Resource Management*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This graduate diploma enables students to gain the skills and knowledge relating to environmental issues, and to be able to assist in resource management including forests, wetlands, geothermal areas and coastal regions.

Graduates will be able to:

- identify environmental risks and hazards; and;
- apply appropriate measures to ensure continued sustainability and effective management of natural resources.

**Pending approval*

Short Course Certificate in Nursing in New Zealand

Duration: 6 weeks full-time

Qualification Details

This short course certificate provides overseas registered nurses with a qualification which meets the Nursing Council of New Zealand's requirements for registration.

Graduates will be able to:

- meet the requirements for NCNZ registration as a registered nurse.

Entry Criteria

Admission and entry requirements for this qualification are in accordance with Waiariki's Academic Regulations and the following criteria:

- applicants must provide evidence of Nursing Council of New Zealand registration or practicing certificate; and
- applicants must provide evidence of immunity status.

English Language Competency

All overseas applicants for New Zealand registration (whose applications are received on or after 1 January 2009, including applicants from English speaking countries) will be required to successfully complete an English language assessment to be registered in New Zealand.

Diploma in Enrolled Nursing*

Duration: 18 months full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma enables enrolled nurses to work in a variety of practice areas under the direction and delegation of a registered nurse. Competencies for the enrolled nurse include professional responsibility, management of care, interpersonal relationships and inter-professional health care and quality improvement.

Students will be prepared to sit the state final examination to enter the register for enrolled nurses under the regulations of the Nursing Council of New Zealand.

Graduates will be able to:

- safely care for clients/patients in specified areas of practice in a variety of health care settings under the direction of a registered nurse;
- practice within the ethical and legal parameters of the enrolled nurse, maintaining professional standards of practice;
- practice in a manner which would be described as culturally safe and acceptable to the tangata whenua; and
- communicate effectively with clients/patients, whanau/families and members of the health care team.

**Pending approval*

Bachelor of Nursing

Duration: 3 years full-time

Qualification Details

This degree produces graduates who demonstrate competence to practice at a beginning level in all domains of practice for registered nurses as identified by Nursing Council of New Zealand (NCNZ) (2005). This qualification enables graduates to work in a variety of clinical contexts.

Successful completion of the Bachelor of Nursing will enable students to sit NCNZ examination for registration as a nurse and apply for registration status as a New Zealand registered nurse.

Graduates will be able to:

- provide and/or facilitate the provision of nursing care within a variety of settings;
- demonstrate a knowledge of the Treaty of Waitangi and its implications to health and health care delivery;
- demonstrate the abilities of an empowered and self-directed learner;
- comprehend, critique and apply knowledge from nursing and related disciplines in an appropriate and safe practice context;
- critically analyse and apply the principles of primary health care within a variety of settings;
- competently practice within legal and ethical parameters of the nursing profession;
- actively contribute to the profession of nursing through ongoing personal and professional development;
- recognise, value, critique and apply research to nursing practice;
- establish effective communication strategies and therapeutic relationships with clients and health care team members;
- collaborate and participate with colleagues and members of the health care team to facilitate and coordinate care; and
- meet the requirements of the NCNZ for registration as a registered nurse.

Entry Criteria

Admission and entry requirements for this qualification are in accordance with Waiariki's Academic Regulations and the following criteria:

- applicants must be 17 years and over, in accordance with Nursing Council of New Zealand requirements; and
- applicants who have had a criminal conviction at any time in the past must declare the circumstances in confidence to the school director or associate director.



Bachelor of Nursing for Registered Nurses

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This degree provides registered nurses from overseas with the opportunity to upgrade their nursing qualification to the Bachelor of Nursing through a specific programme of study that recognises and builds upon their previous qualification and experience within a variety of health care and other settings.

The qualification prepares nurses who:

- are safe, competent and accountable within a variety of health care and other settings;
- demonstrate the value and importance of an individual's culture and uniqueness within their nursing practice;
- act to enhance the professional development of self and others; and
- use critical thinking and reflection to contribute to the ongoing development of nursing knowledge, nursing practice and nursing research.

Graduates will be able to:

- provide and/or facilitate the provision of nursing care within a partnership framework that recognises and values collective and individual differences, worth and dignity;
- demonstrate knowledge of the Treaty of Waitangi and its implications to health and health care delivery and hence facilitate the provision of culturally safe nursing care in different social, political, economic and cultural contexts;

- demonstrate the abilities of an empowered and self-directed learner who is able to reflect on self and practice; and
- comprehend, critique and apply knowledge from nursing and other related disciplines in an appropriate and safe practice context.

Note: The award of the Bachelor of Nursing does not change the registered nurse's scope of practice or lead to registration as a nurse in New Zealand. Entry to professional practice is regulated by the Nursing Council of New Zealand and international nurses must complete a Competency Assessment Programme to work as a registered nurse in New Zealand.

Entry Criteria

Admission and entry requirements for this qualification are in accordance with Waiariki's Academic Regulations and the following criteria:

International

Applicants must have successfully completed a nursing qualification, leading to registration which is recognised by Nursing Council of New Zealand. Applicants intending to practice in New Zealand must apply for New Zealand registration with the Nursing Council of New Zealand prior to commencement of the degree, as further practicum experience and demonstration of nursing practice competencies may be required.

Graduate Diploma in Infection Prevention and Control

Includes:

- Graduate Certificate in Infection Prevention and Control

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This graduate diploma, which includes an embedded graduate certificate, provides the skills and knowledge to coordinate, develop and implement an infection prevention and control programme within a health, disability or aged care setting.

Graduates will be able to:

- demonstrate an understanding of the professional and management issues pertaining to the implementation and coordination of an infection prevention control programme utilising evidence-based and best practice research;
- identify the criteria required for the development, coordination and implementation of an effective infection prevention and control surveillance system;
- demonstrate an understanding of the principles of developing and implementing culturally appropriate infection prevention and control practices and procedures, including the implications of the Treaty of Waitangi for health care providers;
- understand the chain of infection and its physiological basis;
- demonstrate an understanding of the principles of epidemiology and epidemiological research;
- identify the criteria required for the development and coordination of an effective infection control surveillance system;
- analyse best practice strategies for managing and containing infectious diseases in health, disability and aged care facilities; and
- critically analyse the requirements within hospital or long term care environments with relation to disinfection and sterilisation.



Professional Cookery and Patisserie

Diploma in Culinary Arts*

Includes:

- National Certificate in Hospitality (Professional Cookery) (Level 4) strand Patisserie
- London City & Guilds Diploma in Culinary Arts

Duration: 2 years full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma, which includes an embedded national certificate, develops essential culinary skills and knowledge to an applied level in a range of culinary disciplines. Students will gain practical experience and increased capability in food and kitchen safety, nutrition, kitchen operations and planning, and preparation and presentation of cuisine.

Graduates will be able to:

- produce safe food in a professional industrial food production premise, meet regional requirements in food safety and self-evaluate safe practices;
- produce a complex array of food products utilising the full range of culinary cookery methods;
- demonstrate a knowledge of cheese production;
- produce a selection of small goods utilising larder and butchery skills;
- demonstrate the ability to plan and produce a menu for a large function to meet customers' needs;
- produce a culinary staff roster utilising government legislation to meet production needs;
- demonstrate knowledge of nutrition and its principles to meet customers' needs;
- produce a range of patisserie products with an understanding of production principles;
- continue as an independent life-long learner, with the flexibility and capability to respond positively to changes within a dynamic global and local culinary environment; and
- pursue an area of interest.

**Pending approval*

Diploma in Patisserie and Bakery*

Includes:

- London City & Guilds Diploma in Patisserie

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma develops essential culinary skills and knowledge to an applied level in a range of patisserie and bakery disciplines. Students will gain practical experience and increased capability in patisserie and bakery production, developed using principle-based methods as well as aspects of artistic presentation of patisserie, regional cuisine and developing and producing a marketable patisserie product.

Graduates will be able to:

- produce safe food in a professional industrial food production premise, meet regional requirements in food safety and self-evaluate safe practices;
- produce a complex array of food products utilising the full range of culinary cookery methods;
- produce a range of patisserie products with an understanding of production principles;
- produce a range of bakery products with an understanding of the principle production methods;
- produce designer patisserie based on the understanding of arts and art history;
- demonstrate knowledge in regional cuisines;
- develop a food product to merchandise;
- continue as an independent life-long learner, with the flexibility and capability to respond positively to changes within a dynamic global and local culinary environment; and
- pursue an area of interest.

**Pending approval*

Diploma in Culinary Management*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma develops essential culinary skills and knowledge to an applied level in a range of culinary management disciplines. Students will gain practical experience and increased capability in food and kitchen safety, nutrition, kitchen operations and planning, catering for large groups, culinary gastronomy and styles of cuisine.

Graduates will be able to:

- produce safe food in a professional industrial food production premise, meet regional requirements in food safety and self-evaluate safe practices;
- produce an array of culinary dishes utilising the full range of culinary cookery methods;
- apply knowledge of kitchen management in aspects of kitchen production;
- demonstrate knowledge in preparing and managing large groups;
- demonstrate knowledge of staff management in a commercial kitchen;
- apply knowledge of gastronomic topics;
- continue as an independent life-long learner, with the flexibility and capability to respond positively to changes within a dynamic global and local culinary environment; and
- pursue an area of interest.

Social Sciences, Māori and Indigenous Development

Bachelor of Applied Social Science (Social Work)

Duration: 3 years full-time

Qualification Details

This degree provides the foundation knowledge and professional skills that will enable students to demonstrate the competencies of a beginning social worker and meet the qualification requirements of the New Zealand Social Workers Registration Board for registration as a social worker.

Graduates will be able to:

- understand both Māori and Western European based models of practice;
- exhibit the knowledge, skills and disposition of a beginning social worker;
- work collaboratively with other professionals to support the needs of clients and families/whānau;
- demonstrate a sound understanding of the evolution of Aotearoa/New Zealand society and the significance of the Te Tiriti o Waitangi/Treaty of Waitangi with regard to historical and contemporary social issues;
- have a social and political awareness, particularly of the structures, behaviours and processes which disadvantage and oppress people, and practices which promote social change and social justice;
- understand and apply skills required to work competently and safely in social work practice fields that reflect the multicultural nature of contemporary New Zealand society;
- engage in self-directed learning to inform practice, and identify further professional development directions;
- articulate a sound integrated philosophy of social work practice that reflects a commitment to ethical practice and client self-determination;

- demonstrate application of practices that support Māori well-being in accordance with the Aotearoa New Zealand Association of Social Workers (ANZASW) Code of Ethics and any other relevant codes of ethics, conduct or practice in consideration of cultural practices;
- apply the skills required to perform accurate assessments and plan appropriate interventions;
- understand the importance and role of professional supervision to support safe practice, and participate in clinical, administrative and cultural supervision;
- work with clients to access resources and services in a variety of settings;
- use research information resources to support social work decision making;
- accurately record social work documentation and reports; and
- work effectively in organisational settings, maintaining a clear understanding of the social work role.

Entry Criteria

Admission and entry requirements for this qualification are in accordance with Waiariki's Academic Regulations and the following criteria:

- entry may be granted to candidates who have previously gained social science qualifications as specified in the qualification regulations;
- candidates will be required to undergo police vetting; and
- candidates may be required to attend an interview.

Special Entry Conditions

Applicants who do not meet all entry requirements may be required for provisional entry (if aged under 20) or special entry (if aged 20 or over).

Bachelor of Māori Development

Duration: 3 years full-time

Majors Available

- Communications
- Resource Management
- Business Enterprise
- Cultural Heritage

This degree provides a solid base for students wishing to contribute to Māori development, by teaching a range of skills relevant to contemporary Māori development issues while maintaining and further developing knowledge in cultural contexts. Students will develop management, business and communication skills valuable in the context of Māori development and interactions with a culturally diverse population, both within and beyond Aotearoa/New Zealand. The qualification also aims to extend and reinforce relevant cultural knowledge and skills important in maintaining a Māori identity in development activities.

Graduates will be able to:

- contribute to a range of Māori development activities in a range of contexts;
- communicate at a high level both verbally and in writing;
- work confidently with communication technology;
- show a confidence in Māori environments and in their knowledge of tikanga and kawa as it applies to Māori development contexts;
- demonstrate business and enterprise related skills which will contribute to positive development in industries and ventures related to te ao Māori inaianei (current) and existing and emerging Māori interests; and
- demonstrate knowledge of policy, and the history and processes of settlements contributing to ongoing Māori development.



Diploma in Adventure Tourism*

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides the skills to meet current industry standards for adventure tourism and outdoor education. Base skills learnt are transferable into a variety of outdoor careers. The skills and knowledge allow for immediate employment into the industry, business start-up ventures or higher level studies.

Graduates will be able to:

- competently guide a raft at Grade 2 and/or 3;
- achieve sea kayaking instructor level;
- accomplish base skills to pathway into the mountain industry, including rope systems;
- perform pre-hospital emergency care;
- accomplish leadership tasks including risk management, environment judgements, and business start up;
- perform outdoor activities with an understanding of the impacts of adventure tourism in terms of cultural, historical aspects and also legislative regulations; and
- pursue an area of interest, which could include event management, passenger licence and more.

Diploma in Applied Tourism Management

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma provides fundamental management principles combined with applied practices in tourism activities.

Graduates will be able to:

- seek employment in a supervisor role in the tourism industry; and/or
- continue further study on the Diploma in Tourism Management or the Bachelor of Tourism Management.

Diploma in Tourism Management

Includes:

- Diploma in Applied Tourism Management

Duration: 2 years full-time

Qualification Details

This diploma enhances students' tourism knowledge, providing the management skills and knowledge required to successfully work in and manage a sustainable tourism operation in Aotearoa/New Zealand.

Graduates will be able to:

- apply management skills and knowledge to a range of businesses, particularly in the tourism industry;
- operate in role such as sales, marketing, human resource management, or management of small to medium tourist operations;
- pursue further study in Year 3 of the Bachelor of Tourism Management;
- transfer into the Bachelor of Applied Management; and
- pursue an area of interest.





Bachelor of Tourism Management

Duration: 3 years full-time

Majors Available

- manage a tourism related business or organisation in a multicultural environment, after gaining relevant industry experience;
- apply research techniques to real-world situations, as part of their development as independent and effective problem-solvers; and
- pursue an area of interest.

Graduate Diploma in Tourism Management

Duration: 1 year full-time

Qualification Details

This graduate diploma provides a holistic view of tourism organisations and examines the interface between tourism activity, the community and the environment. This qualification enables students to develop the management skills and knowledge required to successfully work in and manage a sustainable tourism operation.

Graduates will be able to:

- understand the nature of the tourism industry, the impacts of tourism on host communities and the sound management of tourism related businesses;
- think independently and critically with respect to the management of the tourism resource in both domestic and international contexts;
- understand essential management principles including marketing, planning and sustainability;
- manage a tourism-related business or organisation in a multicultural environment;
- produce, analyse and synthesise empirical data contributing to well-informed decision making; and
- apply research techniques to real world situations, as part of their development into independent and effective problem solvers.

A place where young talented athletes can prioritise their sport

The Academy of Sport at Waiariki was launched in 2007 to provide an environment where young, talented athletes can prioritise their sport while also gaining a tertiary qualification.

Sport science and medicine support is managed by the Academy of Sport staff. Services to athletes include individual programme planning, testing, and prescription in areas such as exercise physiology, biomechanics, and physical training and conditioning. Academy staff work with the athletes, their individual coaches, and their mentors to provide complete support through training and competition.

The Waiariki region offers ideal training environments in numerous sports. Besides the major sports, the academy focuses on those for which this region is so well known, including mountain biking, kayaking and golf.

Modelled on the New Zealand Academy of Sport System

The Academy of Sport is modelled on New Zealand Academy of Sport (NZAS), the government high performance sport system that delivers support to New Zealand's most elite athletes. It bridges the gap between when athletes leave secondary school and when they reach the fully supported NZAS system.

Backed by Bay of Plenty's First Sport Science Facility

Waiariki launched a sport science facility on campus in February 2008. This facility provides athletes with a further platform and edge to develop and push their sporting potential.

In 2010 Waiariki opened a new sport and recreation centre on Mokoia Campus. This enhances the offer of a "one-stop" training centre of excellence for aspiring athletes.

Training Squads – the Academy of Sport offers four training squads:

- Mountain Bike/Bike Squad
- Kayak/Waka Ama Squad
- Golf Squad
- General Sports Squad

These squads provide the opportunity to train alongside other talented athletes with the very best support. For information on squads and coaches, visit www.waiariki.ac.nz.

The Academy of Sport welcomes applications from young talented athletes in any sport.

Scholarship criteria includes:

- (1) Quality of current sporting success;
- (2) Potential to achieve on the world stage; and
- (3) Priority sport status. Currently, priority sports include golf, kayaking, mountain biking, hockey, netball, rugby, squash, triathlon and waka ama.

In 2011 we will offer two tiers of scholarships based on the quality of individual applications.

- New Zealand's three-year degree is at the same level as the final three years of a four-year bachelor's degree in most countries. This is mainly because New Zealand students complete an extra year at high school.

English Language Courses*

- Entry requirements vary based on the NZQA level of the qualification:
 - Degrees and Level 7 and 8 qualifications must have IELTS 6.0 or equivalent score; and
 - Certificates and diplomas below Level 7 must have an IELTS 5.5 or equivalent score.
 - Higher IELTS scores apply to some qualifications.

Academic Entry Requirements*

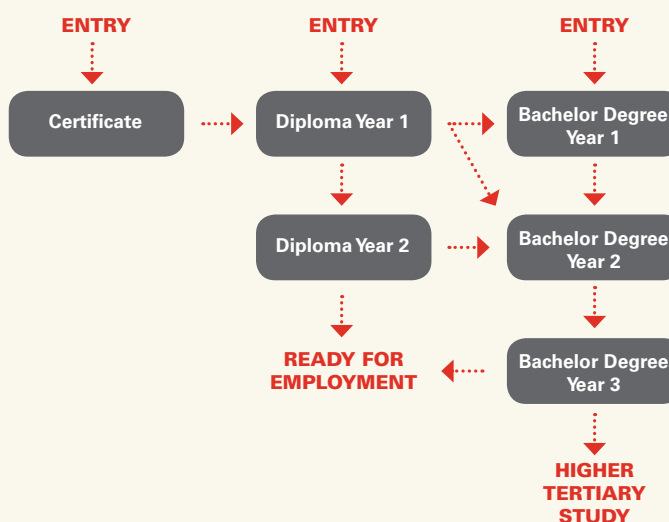

Frequently Asked Questions

Q How does Waiariki welcome international students?

Upon your arrival into New Zealand we can arrange to pick you up at Auckland or Rotorua Airport if you request it. The International Team will meet with you on your first day and ensure that you are given all the necessary information you need to begin your course and to settle into Waiariki and into Rotorua. Waiariki promotes a bicultural vision and all new students are welcomed at the start of their course with a pohiri (traditional Māori welcome ceremony) at Tangatarua Marae.

Q Who is the International Team and how can they help?

Based in the International Centre, our friendly team members can speak Mandarin, Cantonese, Hindi, Tamil, Punjabi, Oriya, Bengali, Norwegian, Danish, Swedish, French and Māori. They provide a full range of pastoral care and specialist services such as:

- accommodation support, airport pickup, orientation, banking and general advice, cultural and personal support
- specialist services for applications, enrolments, online student visa applications, graduate job search visas, medical and health insurance
- Waiariki is an official IELTS Testing Centre to provide proof of English competency for entry into mainstream qualifications
- You are welcome to call in at any time during weekdays

Q Where can I stay?

Hostel

Waiariki House provides quality accommodation at reasonable rates. The hostel is located in the heart of the city, just a short walk from many amenities and an easy city bus ride to the Rotorua campus. Waiariki House provides a clean, safe, secure and friendly atmosphere. Waiariki House is a privately owned company independent from Waiariki Institute of Technology, and is our preferred hostel. Students from many countries, including New Zealand, stay at and enjoy Waiariki House – the best of both worlds – independence and support. Sign up for a minimum of one semester accommodation at Waiariki House and get a special rate.

Homestay

New Zealand families provide homestay accommodation for students who prefer to live in a family setting. This is a good way to improve your English and learn about New Zealand culture. All homestay families have been interviewed by Waiariki to ensure they meet the Ministry of Education requirements for hosting students.

Q Can I work while studying in New Zealand?

If you wish to work in New Zealand, the minimum legal pay is NZ\$12.75 per hour (before tax). Advice on rights to employment in New Zealand while studying is available through the Immigration New Zealand website: www.immigration.govt.nz.

Q How much does it cost to live in Rotorua?

Rotorua is a less expensive city to live in compared to the major cities like Auckland and Wellington. It is important that you are financially prepared for your stay in New Zealand. Some typical costs are (in NZ\$):

If you are planning to live independently (not in a hostel or homestay), you should expect to incur the following approximate expenses, based on a per-week basis (in NZ\$):

Also allow for other expenses such as telephone and entertainment.

Q What kind of support can I expect from Waiariki?

- Drop-in support of our friendly International Team, as detailed above
- The Library Learning Centre offers a full range of resources available for your study needs
- Learner Support is available for extra assistance outside of class, to develop study and English writing skills and test techniques for exams
- Health and Counselling – confidential comprehensive health services are available on campus
- Access to computer suites to work on assignments outside class hours
- A café and restaurant are conveniently located on campus
- Waiariki's Rotorua campus supports a wireless network, so you can bring your own computer if you wish
- Students' Association (WITSA) membership is included in your fees. WITSA is run by students for students, providing social activities, academic and personal help

Q What medical and travel insurance do I need?

The cost is \$491 per year. International students must have appropriate and current medical and travel insurance while studying in New Zealand. Uni-care is our preferred

insurance provider. It is important to understand the inclusions stated in their Policy wording for the New Zealand Student Plan on the Uni-care website: www.uni-care.org.

Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. If you receive medical treatment during your visit, you may be liable for the full costs of that treatment. Full details on entitlements to publicly funded health services are available through the Ministry of Health website: www.moh.govt.nz.

Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC) provides accident insurance for all New Zealand citizens, residents and temporary visitors to New Zealand, but you may still be liable for all other medical and related costs. Further information can be viewed on the ACC website: www.acc.co.nz.

Q How do I know I'm getting a high quality education and support from Waiariki?

Waiariki is a government-owned tertiary education provider registered with the New Zealand Government and holds Quality Assured status.

Waiariki has agreed to observe and be bound by the Code of Practice for the Pastoral Care of International Students published by the Minister of Education. Copies of the code are available from this Institution or from the New Zealand Ministry of Education website: www.minedu.govt.nz/goto/international.

Q What social activities are available to take part in?

Numerous sports clubs, student events and special events take place on Waiariki campuses throughout the year. These provide great opportunities for you to have fun while meeting people and making new friends. The International Team publishes an annual calendar of events and activities that you are welcome and encouraged to attend.

The new Waiariki Community Recreation Centre on the Rotorua campus provides a gymnasium, weights room, squash court, and fitness classes. Sports clubs in badminton, basketball, football and more are included in the affordable membership fees.

As a tourist town, surrounded by natural beauty, the city hosts many fun activities and events, geothermal features, water activities on many lakes, mountain biking, river kayaking and rafting, golf, summer tramping, athletic competitions and Māori cultural activities. Some of New Zealand's best beaches are within a one-hour drive. In just two and half hours from Rotorua, you can be skiing on majestic snow capped mountains.

Q What are the rules of New Zealand immigration?
